

HELP NEEDED AT ST. VINCENT DE PAUL DÉJÀ VU THRIFT SHOP

Can you volunteer a few hours a week to help needy families in our area? The Déjà vu thrift shop helps hundreds of families access free and low cost clothing, furniture, housewares, etc.. Profits go to SVdP conferences to help families with urgent needs such as food, rent, utilities, medicine, and transportation. Our Voucher Program supplies free furniture and housewares to families who have no means of purchasing items. We need help to deliver these items from our Aurora location (Sullivan Road) on Saturday mornings between 9 AM to Noon. We also need volunteers to pick up, clean and repair donated furniture at this location.

The Déjà vu shop is also short of volunteers for Fridays and Saturdays. There is flexibility to volunteer all day, mornings, or afternoons. Qualifications include learning simple cash register skills, ability to walk up and down stairs, sort donations, lift 10 pound bags/boxes, and greet customers. Our store team has a lot of fun as they work and would love you to be a part!



Sanctuary Course for Catholics

Would you value joining others in a conversation about mental health? Would you like to discover what God, Scripture, and Church have to say in light of the experiences of mental health challenges? The subject matter feels particularly relevant in these times of heightened anxiety, and the course creates an opportunity to connect with and support each other in meaningful ways. ABOUT THE COURSE

The Sanctuary Course for Catholics is an eight-part course for small groups designed to raise awareness and start conversations in local parishes regarding mental health. It was created in collaboration with Catholic mental health professionals, theologians, and clergy, and offers faith communities the opportunity to learn about mental health and grow in their ability to support members living with mental health challenges. Topics covered include: mental health and mental illness, stigma, recovery, companionship, self-care, and community. The sessions are accompanied by compelling films that feature the stories of Catholics living with mental health challenges, along with the insights of archbishops, theologians, and psychologists.

Catholic Charities invites you to join in viewing and discussing the *Sanctuary Course for Catholics*. We will view the films together followed by group discussion. All are welcome!
